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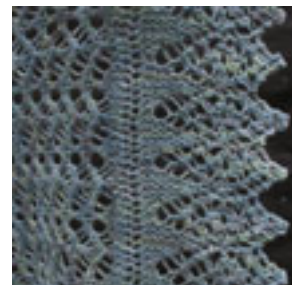
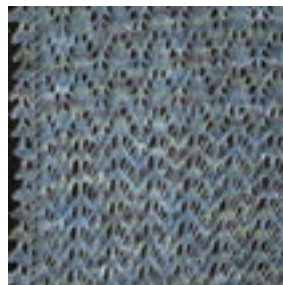
Finished measurements: 20 (23" / 51 (56.5) cm wide x 72 (94" / 143 (213.5) cm long. Substituting yarn and/or needles may result in an overall variation in shawl size.

Yarn: 2 skeins Fybershapes Fibers Laceweight Merino (100% merino wool; 410 yds/375 m per 2 oz/57 g) or Alabris. If substituting: 500 (1100) yds/450 (1000) m of laceweight yarn that has 400 yds/360 m per 2 oz/57 g.

Needles & Notions: size 6 US (4 mm) needles or size to obtain correct gauge, size 4 US (3.5 mm) needles for edging.

Gauge: 24 sts and 32 rows = 4" (10 cm) in unblocked 2x2.

Construction Notes: Knit in two pieces then grafted, and edging knit on after.
