

Traditionally inspired with a modern fit, this jacket combines merino wool-herringbone patterning with vibrant color work bands at the neck, cuffs, and collar. Stormtrooper is the Norwegian name for the storm jacket, a sweater.

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Finished bust measurements: 32 (35 1/2, 44, 48, 52) / 81.5 (90, 101.5, 112, 122, 128) cm

Yarn: 3 (1/2, 1/2, 1/2, 1/2, 1/2) balls Rowan 3-Ply Strikemaster (100% wool, 115 yd/105 m per 1 lb, 450 g) in Dark Steel Grey (BC) #1387, 1 ball each Deep Aspen Blue (CC1) #2586, Medium Grey Blue (CC2) #138, Steel Grey (CC3) #1387, and Red (CC4) #138

Needles & Notions: set of 4 or 5 size 4 US (3.5 mm) dpns, size US (3.5 mm) 32 (30 cm) and 16" (40 cm) circular; set of 4 or 5 size 5 US (3.75 mm) dpns, size 5 US (3.75 mm) 32" (80 cm) and 16" (40 cm) circular; tapestry needle, stitch marker, 10 (10, 10, 11, 11, 11) 1/2" (12 mm) buttons, stitch holder, sewing needle and thread to match MC, optional sewing machine. For the larger sizes, you may wish to substitute a 47" length for the longer circular needle.

Gauge: 24 sts and 30 rows = 4" (10 cm) over Herringbone pattern

Construction Notes: Sweater is worked flat from the bottom up, except for the color bands knit in the round and deconstructed. The details are cut before attaching the button bands. Sleeves are knit in the round. See the [pattern page](#) on the Tote Collective blog for a tutorial on details.
