



A kimono-inspired jacket worked in Fair Isle-style stranded colorwork with duplicate stitch accents and wide contrasting borders

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Finished measurements:

Bust: 36 ½ (44, 51 ¼)" / 92.5 (112, 130) cm

Length: 21 (24 ½, 24 ½)" / 53.5 (62, 62) cm

Shown in size 44" / 112 cm

Intended to be worn with 6–8" / 15–20.5 cm ease.

Yarn: Dale of Norway Falk (116 yds / 106 m per 1 ¾ oz / 50 g ball; 100% Wool):

6 (7, 8) balls in #5582 Deep Navy (A)

5 (6, 6) balls in #5813 Mist Blue (B)

1 (2, 2) balls in #3418 Burnt Orange (C)

3 (4, 4) balls in #4536 Magenta (D)

1 ball in #5943 Soft Blue (E)

Yarn requirements are given for the 12 ¼" / 31 cm sleeve shown. For the longer sleeve variation, an additional ball of colors A and B will be required.

Needles & Notions:

Size 4 US / 3.5 mm:

- 2 circular needles, 32" / 80 cm long
- set of 5 double-pointed needles

Size 7 US / 4.5 mm circular needle, 32" / 80 cm long

Size 3 US / 3.25 mm circular needles, 32" / 80 cm and 16" / 40 cm long

Size 2 US / 3 mm:

- circular needle, 32" / 80 cm long
- set of 5 double-pointed needles

Cable needle, sewing machine, thread, scissors stitch markers, tapestry needle, four buttons 1" / 25 mm diameter

Gauge: 24 stitches and 25 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Stockinette stitch over Chart A with size 4 US / 3.5 mm needle

Construction Notes: The body of this jacket is knit in Fair Isle-style stranded color work, with the patterns presented in chart form only. The jacket begins with a turned hem, then the body is worked in the round with steeks at center front and at the armholes. Sleeves are also worked in the round. The steeks are reinforced with machine stitching, then cut open. Duplicate stitch embroidery accents the upper back and sleeves. The front bands include a welt that encloses the cut edge of the steek, and a wide zig-zag ribbing, which is echoed on the cuffs. The cut edges of the armhole steeks are covered with facings at the tops of the sleeves.

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
