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This double breasted jacket is made in an allover textured stitch pattern, with overlapping front panels in a complementary stitch. Long set-in sleeves and a ribbed collar shaped with short rows provide a tailored finish.

Gauge: 20 sts and 28 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Stockinette Stitch; 19 sts and 32 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Little Knot Stitch; 23 sts and 32 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Daisy Stitch

Construction Notes: This jacket is worked seamlessly from the bottom up. The front panels and body are worked at the same time. The sleeves are worked separately to the armholes, then joined to the body. The yoke is worked in one piece to the shoulders, with the sleeve caps and front neck shaped along the way. The shoulders are grafted together. The collar is worked from stitches picked up around the neckline. Directions for the stitch patterns are given in row-by-row instructions only.

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
