

Knit Three Together (k3tog)



This is a right-leaning double decrease.
It looks the same on the right side as [p3tog](#).
It mirrors with left-leaning decreases such as [sssk](#), and [sl1, k2tog, pssso](#).



Insert the right needle into three stitches at once.
